Welcome to Mulan's journey...

A journey which by it's very nature, reflects the journey each of us make as we consider our place and our purpose in society. With every single musical theater production, our creative team strengthens our realization that there are truly so many incredible opportunities for our kids to solidify life skills when producing these musicals.... and it's not all just because of the thinking skills developed when learning to sing, dance and act simultaneously.

The material is rampant with understanding of the human condition.

Mulan explores six Chinese virtues: Honor, Destiny, Loyalty, Love, Strength and Pathway/Change, as well as an understanding of the forces of Yin/Yang and how a necessary mix of masculine and feminine is important to our well being and ability to contribute to our families and our society.

One alone is not enough, you need both together.

Are most young people thrust into thinking about these types of life choices when their free time is occupied with hours of social media and video games? I think not.

And even those who are readers... and spend their time in books.... (me! me!) are still alone with their thoughts.

Musical theater performers have opportunities to sift through potential life choices with others, to see and feel live responses to words and actions that will ultimately affect their own choices when they are faced with similar situations.

The text, the music, the movement, all enhance their ability to understand the impact that individual choices can make. What a tool for societal change! We are not designed to be alone, not even at birth or death.... and yet society consistently pushes us toward that goal.

And what individuals reek the biggest havoc in society? The loners, who are crying out for contact. Any contact.

We must have opportunities to **connect** to understand the full impact of our choices on others. Mulan sets off alone on her journey, but quickly learns that she gains strength, insight and support from her friends, her family, even her ancestors.

Our creative team is passionate about what we do. We see the powerful impact that musical theater has on your children every single day. As I look out on the stage and see it filled with so many strong, confident, and **powerful** young people who just a few short years ago were just beginning to taste the benefits that music theater can provide, my heart can't help but swell with pride. To borrow sentiment from Mulan's father, Fa Zhou:

The greatest gift and honor is having the opportunity to share our passion with these young people.

And to all of the parents, friends and families, I hope you revel in knowing that your children have taken the first step. Thank you for assisting your kids to get off their couches and out from in front of their screens... and thrusting them in the midst of a hardworking, goal driven musical theater ensemble, where they can understand that their actions have real value.

They are changing the course of their lives. Forever.
